About Varanasi

'Banaras is older than history, older than tradition, older even than legend and looks twice as old as all of them put together' – Mark Twain

Situated on the banks of the Ganges, Varanasi, Banaras or Kashi is one of the oldest living cities of the world. Being a seat of knowledge, spiritual attainment and enlightenment, it attracted the attention of the great philosophers, patriots, scholars, and travellers since historical times. In addition to being an important centre for Hinduism, other religious factions like Buddhism have thrived here. Lord Buddha, after his enlightenment, preached his first sermon at Sarnath, only 10 kms away from the city centre. The Ashokan Pillar, along with the lion capital is still preserved there along with other relics. Besides the numerous temples scattered around the city, a boat ride along the river bank or ghats, a walk through the maze-like alleys and bye lanes, the sound of temple bells mixed with the smell of incense truly reflect the spirit of 'Kashi'.



Varanasi is well connected to all the major cities by air rail and road. Varanasi Airport is about 35kms away from the city. Railway stations accessible from BHU are Varanasi Junction (8 km) and Mughalsarai (18kms).

Temperature in February varies from 15°C - 25°C. Weather remains pleasant but light woollen wear is suggested.

The title should be bold, followed by the name of the authors and their institutional address with email address of the corresponding author. The name of the presenting author should be underlined, the abstract should be typed in single space using Microsoft Word (Times New Roman, font12). All abstracts should be emailed to
